# The Kite Runner

### Introductory Research

The purpose of this assignment is to gain background knowledge relevant to the novel we will be reading, *The Kite Runner*. As a class, we will share this information as an anticipatory guide. The assignment is worth 50 points.

- 1. Student Learning Outcomes: At the end of this project you will be able to...
  - a. Locate and read at least two sources of information about a topic including books, Internet sources, documentary films or encyclopedias.
  - b. Present a short oral presentation of the research results to your classmates

### 2. What you need to do:

- a. Working with a partner or a small group of 4 (must be approved), choose one of the topics to research related to *The Kite Runner*. The more specific the topic, the better it will be (ex. Sunni Muslims in Afghanistan, rather than Muslims in general)
- b. Find at least 2 sources and read through them. Gather the most important details about your topic.
- c. Share your information in a presentation to a small group of classmates.
  - i. This could be a video, keynote, oral presentation
  - ii. Get the class involved to remember the information! Be creative!
